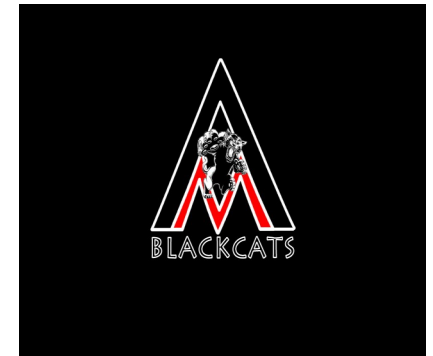

# What is Title I, Part A

## Title I, Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA)

Provides financial assistance to states and school districts to meet the educational needs of students at-risk of failing the state's challenging performance Standards in mathematics, reading, and writing. Title I, Part A provides additional instructional services and activities which support students identified failing or most at risk of failing.

### Title I, Part A further explained

Title I, Part A is one of the many federal programs in the No Child Left Behind Act of 2001. Title I, Part A provides formula grants to districts. Districts then allocate funds to Title I schools based on their number of low-income children

The district must use Title I funds only in schools that have been selected for services through allowable procedures. Funds are used to improve student achievement in high poverty schools. The Title I, Part A Handbook contains comprehensive information about all Title I requirements for districts and schools. ### How Does Title I, Part A support James D. Adams Middle School?

For the 2016—2017 School Year, James D. Adams Middle School received \$90,489 in Title I funds. The SBDM Council allocated 1 certified staff positions and 1 classified staff position. The remaining money is used to cover operational expenses including copier rent, supplies, and technology. Also, AMS receives \$1,449.50 for Parent Involvement which is used as two-way communication including postage, printing, and awards.
